

The Village of Nehawka Board of Trustees met in special session on Wednesday, September 14, 2022 at the Nehawka Community Building. Chairman June Bennett called the meeting to order at 6:17 p.m., noted the Open Meetings Act displayed for public viewing, roll call of the board. In attendance: June Bennett, Bob Sorenson, John Henderson, Jason Jackson, Tim Dineen. Other attendees: Tammy Wright, Tom Prickett, Atty and John Winters, Accountant.

Village Budget 2022/2023 – The board was given copies of the proposed budget for 2022-2023, John Winters went over the budget, Mr. Winter also stated that the board needed to consider, approve, and vote for a 1% increase on restricted funds as part of the budget approval. After discussions and questions with the accountant, a motion was made to approve both the budget and 1% increase in restricted funds by Jackson, seconded by Dineen, Motion carried.

One- and Six-Year Road Proposal – Copies of the One Year and Six Plan for the Village was given to the board. After discussion, the board has asked JEO to add Cold Patch Holes and Seal to the One Year Plan at estimated cost of \$6,000. Add to the Six Year Plan, Cold Patch and Seal Holes (\$6,000), Concrete and grading to Maple and North St (\$15,000) and Concrete and grading to Lincoln and Main (\$15,000). Clerk will send over the additions to JEO. A motion was made to approve the One- and Six-Year Proposal with the changes by Jackson, seconded by Dineen. Motion carried.

Nomads Bar New Liquor License – Tammy Wright was present to represent Nomads request from the state for a new liquor license. No discussions. Motion to approve the new liquor license by Henderson, seconded by Dineen, Motion carried.

Motion by Jackson, seconded by Henderson to adjourn at 7:05 p.m. Motion carried.
